





Since mid-March 2011 up until November 2016, VDC was able to document 170,741 battlerelated deaths.



Since mid-March 2011 until end of November 2016, VDC was able to document 108,174 civilians and 62,567 non-civilians battle-related deaths.





Who is responsible for civilian casualties in Syria since mid-March 2011 until November 2016, based on the Violations Documentation Centre in Syria database.





First, November Battle-Related Deaths:

During this month VDC was able to document a total of **1374** deaths across different Syrian governorates, among them, **1191** were documented by full name and **183** are still registered as unknown.



1056 were civilians while 318 were non-civilians.












Fourth, Death by Type of Weapon:

326 of the total 1374 of the battle-related death occurred by firearms and snipers, **677** by aerial attacks and barrel bombs, while tanks, cannons, and mortars accounted for **241** battle-related deaths. Additionally, the VDC was able to document the deaths of 130 under other reasons; sixteen deaths under torture in the Syrian government detention centers, 21 due to the lack of medical and food resources in besieged areas and 75 by land mines planted by ISIS., one as a result of being exposed to the Chlorine gas in Aleppo. While for the rest 16 the cause or the executioner was not undoubtedly identified.





Fifth:

Deaths by Gender





Total number of males over 18 is 913, while the number is 159 for females over 18 years old. Total children battle-related deaths are 302; 185 males and 117 females.





Sixth, Deaths by ISIS:

During this month, VDC was able to document the death of 84 people, 41 are civilians, and 43 from different armed groups.

Seventh, Targeted Attacks on Infrastructure in Aleppo

It is noticeable that during November 2016 many of the attacks targeted Aleppo's infrastructure. During this month alone Violations Documentation Center in Syria documented 26



targeted attacks on health, education, and services facilities. Most of which put out of service as a result of the attacks.

VDC documented attacks by the Syrian and Russian forces on 13 medical and health facilities; 12 hospitals and medicine factory. All out of service now. Additionally, VDC documented the destruction of a total of 13 educational and services facilities by the aerial attacks carried by the Syrian and Russian governments' forces. These facilities are two centers for civil defense (White Helmets); a high school; three factories for garment, sugar, and steel; electricity generator; a heritage mosque; a local traditional market, and an internally displaced camp.

Moreover, VDC documented one attack carried by the opposition armed groups on a school in the Al-forgan neighborhood in Aleppo.

Notes:

These figures are not final in any way, and they are subject to continuous and periodic scrutiny by center's activists, the database administrators, and the field documentation team. Figures may differ between reports, and the most recent report is always considered to be the more accurate.

VDC team pays tribute to all the collaborative activists who extended a helping hand to our center as well as to the families of the victims. We also thank the Field Observation Team whose members face daily dangers executing their duties in Syria in order to document the human rights violations committed there, complete the data, and claim the rights of the distressed families from the concerned bodies and organizations.
